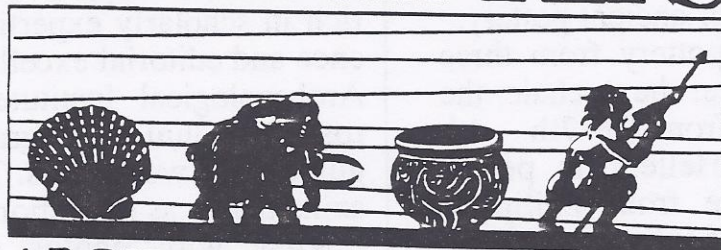

She has had field experiences at Etruscan sites in Italy and a Paolithic site in the Czech Republic.
